Establishing nurturing community relationships

Beating all odds, and with the support of the community, Haguruka has continued to thrive over the years. We are pleased to count more partners since our inception. Our collaborations include community-based organizations that have stood on our side all along, and those that have joined us for specific initiatives. We are grateful for the mutually beneficial relationships we have established, and look forward to continuing our community outreach while nurturing our existing partnerships in the years to come. The two most noteworthy local partnerships on 2016-2017 are highlighted below.

OASIS Centre des femmes

At Haguruka, we consider OASIS Centre des femmes (OCF) as our most closest sister organization. As a agency that exists to equip Francophone women affected by violence in all forms to improve their situation and become fully autonomous in the Greater Toronto Area and Halton-Peel, OCF has been our biggest supporter from our creation throughout the expansion of Haguruka. This year, we established an official partnership that will allow both our organizations to formally work together in 2017 and beyond. We are excited about the possibilities!

Projects:

Supporting long-time partners and fostering innovation

New Cycle of Project "Nawe Nuze" with ANSS

Haguruka has been working with ANSS (Association Nationale de Soutien aux Séropositifs et Malades du Sida) since 2014. In 2016, we renewed our remarkable partnership through another cycle of Nawe Nuze microcredits. The goals are always to reduce the socio-economic impact of HIV/AIDS through supporting the economic activities of women and girls working together in solidarity groups. Details about project and its results are included on the next page of this report.

Fighting Poverty, Malaria and Cilamte Change wih ACECI

A new collaboration took shape this year when Haguruka heard about the work done by ACECI (Agence consultative en éthique de la coopération internationale) through their Bye Bye Malaria initiative. We wanted to be part of a project aiming to improve women's health and finances through the cultivation of evidence-based traditional consumable and medicinal plants. The project has the goal of tackling poverty, preventing malaria using local plants, and fighting the impact of climate change which is linked to the rise of malaria in the region.

"Nawe Nuze" Project with ANSS





Objective

Our partnership with ANSS started in 2014. This year, we supported the second cycle of the initiative. Our project had the goal of reducing the socioeconomic burden of HIV-AIDS on the women affected that are being helped by ANSS, through their Turiho Center. The aim was to achieve this through supporting the economic activities of the women and girls helped in ANSS's solidarity groups. The project was implemented in 4 provinces across Burundi.

Results



With a total assistance of approximately 3 million Fbu, each of the groups helped receiving about 189,000 Fbu.



The project contributed to increasing the number of women helped with the number of solidarity groups going from 43 to 51 groups.



The total number of members increased to 1,164, with loans averaging between \$10 - \$25 per member.



The pictures on the left feature the women leading three of the solidarity groups participating. The group picture features 3 solidarity groups from Kirundo province receiving their funding cheques.

Women's groups invested in a farm of goats and chickens.


Makamba & Gitega Provinces Women's groups rented a field to farm and share the crops among themselves to do as they wish.

Women's groups invested in food business and restauration.


Bujumbura Province

"Women and Community Health" Project with ACECI

Objective

Through this partnership, the ultimate goal was to fighting poverty while using measures that would help eradicate malaria and fight climate change in the process. Haguruka decided to invest in this innovative project as it also sought to reconnect communities to the virtues of using traditional healing plants (such as moringa, catnip, mint, neem and lemongrass) which grow locally, while empowering different groups of women, improving their health and that of their communities. Below are two women profile from the 10 groups that ACECI worked with through this project for which Haguruka was one of the funders.

Supporting Marginalized Women Groups

Agnes, featured on the right, represents a group of Batwa women helped through the project, but traditionally marginalized in Burundi. The women of her association supplied homemade pots in which ACECI stores its herbal teas. Haguruka is proud to be part of this change in the country that seeks to uplift all women, without discrimination.





Helping Fight Urban Poverty

Emilienne, another beneficiary, and is a widow with 7 children representing an association set up to help homeless women in the capital city. Through funds from this project, women in the group rent land, plant seeds that they supply to ACECI which in turn processes the plants into herbal teas, soaps, essential oils and other products.

"Women and Community Health" Project in Pictures

Highlights

Overall, Haguruka contributed 3 million Fbu to the project. Most of our funds went to one specific region, Gihanga (Bubanza province), helping a group of **198 women**. This was the largest group in the entire project.

Priority was given to this group because of the drought that afflicted this region prior to the start of the project, with fear that communities would face famine due to poor crops. Haguruka decided to direct its funding to this vulnerable population, to alleviate the impact of the climate conditions.

The pictures on the right feature the women in action, planting indigenous crops together in solidarity. The plants help protect the soil from further degradation. ACECI installed plant distillery right in the region to process the harvested products into consumable goods that can be used daily to fight diseases (especially malaria, through catnip based products). The sale of the products allowed the women to make a living and support their families and communities economically.


In the upcoming years, we will continue to reach out to communities to support Haguruka in funding local and international projects.




